



RULES, REGULATIONS & POLICIES

Aiken, SC

IMPORTANT INFORMATION: Show Management reserves the right to combine, split, cancel, limit or move classes and divisions as entries warrant, which could mean divisions may change days on which they run or rings in which they are held. Classes may not necessarily be run in the order listed in the class lists. It is the responsibility of the rider to inform the show secretary of any time conflicts as soon as possible after receiving the schedule. Management reserves the right to change officials, limit entries or divisions, combine or cancel classes, modify the schedule, and to modify or cancel awards and/or make whatever changes are required by circumstances to the competition specifications listed herein. Show Management reserves the right to cancel classes insufficiently filled and to refuse or require withdrawal of an entry for cause deemed sufficient by Show Management. Changes will be posted in the Facebook event, sent via email to the email on the entry form and posted in the show office. Show Management reserves the right to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of, or incident to, the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these Rules and Regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Management; their decision to be final.

TREATMENT OF HORSES: Show Management will enforce the fair and humane treatment for all horses participating in the Thoroughbred Incentive Program (T.I.P.) Championships.

PARTICIPATING RIDER CODE OF CONDUCT: The Jockey Club (TJC) expects appropriate behavior from all riders, trainers, spectators and others participating in any TJC event, including events held in conjunction with TJC events. Inappropriate behavior may include, but is not limited to: possession, use or distribution of any illegal drugs; profanity, vulgar language or gestures; harassment (i.e., using words or actions that intimidate, threaten or

persecute others before, during or following The Jockey Club activities); failure to follow rules; and abusing a horse. Reports of inappropriate code of conduct may be made at any time to the Show Manager via email, text, phone call or in-person. Any verbal or physical act of discourtesy toward a judge, show official, volunteer, show staff or TJC staff member on the part of a trainer, owner, rider, handler, groom, family member or person associated with an entry is a violation of the Code of Conduct. Persons found by Show Management to be in violation of this Code of Conduct will be unable to participate in the remainder of the show, will forfeit all fees and awards from previous classes and divisions, and will be ineligible to show at the T.I.P. Championships in 2023, and/or at events held in conjunction with T.I.P. Championships and/or T.I.P. Championships in future years.

COGGINS TEST: South Carolina state law requires that each horse be accompanied by a negative EIA certificate dated within one year.

ENTRIES: The closing date for on-time entries is September 18, 2023. Late entries will be accepted through September 25, 2023, and subject to payment of a \$50 late fee per horse per division. All entries online. After the closing date, all stall deposits and office fees are non-refundable. The entry form must include all mandatory signatures, including legal guardian in the case of a minor exhibiting. **No entries accepted after September 25, 2023.**

STALLS: Permanent 12 X 12 stalls of wood/metal construction with stall mats and doors. Stalls will be assigned on a first come, first served basis. All requests to be stabled with other competitors and all special stabling requests must be included with the horse's entry and will be accommodated when possible. **All stabling requests and changes must be received by Stable View via email by 5:00 PM ET Tuesday, October 3. (secretary@stableviewfarm.com).**

CHANGES: Prior to Tuesday, October 3, all scratches and changes must be sent to the show office and T.I.P. via email to: secretary@stableviewfarm.com and tjctip@jockeyclub.com. After Tuesday, October 3, all changes must be made in person at the show office.

MOTORIZED VEHICLES/GOLF CARTS: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license that allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single-wheeled scooters, is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle or device in violation of these rules is solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of these rules will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other

mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

MINOR EXHIBITORS: Parent(s) or guardian(s) of minor exhibitors shall hold Stable View, The Jockey Club, Horse Show Management and the Facility harmless for any injury to such minor. No child's entry will be accepted or number issued unless entry is signed by a parent or LEGAL guardian. The signature of unrelated persons WILL NOT be accepted.

PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR: Protective headgear, properly secured, must be worn BY ALL RIDERS AT ALL TIMES WHILE MOUNTED, anywhere, anytime on the show grounds. All riders under the age of 18 must wear a helmet at all times. Headgear for all riders must meet or exceed ASTM Standards; must carry the SEI tag; and be properly secured by a harness.

NON-SHOWING HORSES: All non-showing horses must complete an entry blank and be assigned a back number. A \$50 fee will be assessed to any horse not entered in any classes. Stall fee and non-refundable stall deposit applies. Non-showing horses are not permitted in competition rings at any time.

RIBBONS, PRIZES AND PRIZE MONEY

Additional High Point awards may also be offered, including for horses adopted from organizations currently accredited by the Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance (TAA), RRP Thoroughbred Makeover alumni or 2023 RRP Thoroughbred Makeover entered horses.

IMPORTANT – In order to be eligible for AA, Junior, or RRP High Point awards, the status MUST be listed on the 2023 Declaration Form or Hardship Request Declaration Form. In order to be eligible for the TCA/TAA adoption class and TAA High Point awards, the horse’s eligible adoption organization MUST be listed on the 2023 Declaration Form or Hardship Request Declaration Form. It is the owner or rider’s responsibility to indicate a horse or rider is eligible for ANY of these awards. Failure to indicate eligibility for each High Point award (including Junior Riders) on the Declaration Form or Hardship Request Declaration Form will result in exclusion of horse and/or rider from calculation of the High Point awards.

For Dressage: High Point will be based on the best single test per horse/rider combination.

Division placements will be based on the average of the two tests. In case of a tie, the horse/rider with the highest single score is the winner; if the highest scores are the same, the next highest scores will be considered until the tie is broken.

For CT: High Point is given to highest placed eligible horse in each Division. Division placements will be based on the horse’s placing in the CT division.

DOGS: Dogs are not permitted to be loose on competition grounds and must be on a leash or otherwise contained. Individuals must not lead dogs on a leash while mounted. Dog owners are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from their dogs’ behaviors. Failure to maintain your dog, under control, as defined here, will result in a \$100 fine assessed to the owner. In addition, pursuant to facility regulations, loose dogs may be removed from the show grounds at the owner’s expense and impounded by animal control.

ELECTRICAL/FIRE REGULATIONS: All electrical installation and connections must meet all state and county codes. Aisles shall be maintained clear for a minimum of six (6) feet wide by eight (8) feet high. No obstructions or projections shall be allowed in these aisles. No Class I Flammable liquids such as gasoline are allowed inside the buildings. Cooking is not permitted within the stable area. Anyone found in violation shall be subject to dismissal from further participation in the horse

show without recourse.

PARKING: Fire regulations prohibit all vehicles, including trailers, vans and passenger vehicles, from being parked in the stable areas. Vans and trailers will be allowed in the stable area only to load or off-load. PARKING AREAS WILL BE DESIGNATED AND VIOLATORS WILL BE TOWED AT OWNER'S EXPENSE.

RING SIZES:

LIABILITY: The Jockey Club, Stable View Equestrian Center, their officials and employees will not be responsible for any accident or loss which may occur to any exhibitor, spectator, guest, rider, groom, attendant, other employees, animals, or equipment at the events. All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third persons caused by themselves, their employees, their agents, their horses, or their dogs. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events, and to keep that policy up to date.

PHOTO RELEASE: By signing the entry form, I agree to waive the right of use of my photos/videos at the competition and grant The Jockey Club and Stable View Equestrian Center and their agents full use of any and all competition photos and video.

ATTIRE: Proper attire please.

EQUIPMENT: No martingales permitted in flat classes. No equine wraps or bell boots of any kind permitted in

hunter or in-hand classes. Braiding not required.

RULES: Classes will be conducted under current USEF rules unless otherwise noted by Show Management or in these Rules. Whips are not permitted in Dressage Championships classes. All tests may be read in all Dressage classes.

DRUGS AND MEDICATION: Current USEF rules relating to drugs and medications will be enforced.

COVID-19 GUIDELINES: Check Stable View website for up to date information.

DRESSAGE RIDE TIMES: Ride times will be posted.

AT THE FACILITY: Arenas and rings are open for schooling ONLY during posted times. Do not enter the rings or arenas outside of schooling or competition times. Riding on marked trails is permitted. Do not use the cross country course or the Boyd Martin ETB Schooling Field at any time and do not ride off of marked trails.

ARRIVAL INFORMATION: Competitors can arrive anytime on Thursday, October 5. Please try to arrive while it's light - the earlier the better. Barns F-J are accessed via Gate 3 - please select a number along the tree line or fence line and reverse your rig back to it. All Day Parking is accessed via Gate 2. If you reserved a paddock in advance, all paddocks are accessed via Gate 1. Competitors are responsible for night check.



RULES, REGULATIONS & POLICIES

Lexington, KY

IMPORTANT INFORMATION: Show Management reserves the right to combine, split, cancel, limit or move classes and divisions as entries warrant, which could mean divisions may change days on which they run or rings in which they are held. Classes may not necessarily be run in the order listed in the class lists. It is the responsibility of the Rider to inform the Show Secretary of any time conflicts as soon as possible after receiving the schedule. Management reserves the right to change officials, limit entries or divisions, combine or cancel classes, modify the schedule, and to modify or cancel awards and/or make whatever changes are required by circumstances to the competition specifications listed herein. Show Management reserves the right to cancel classes insufficiently filled and to refuse or require withdrawal of an entry for cause deemed sufficient by Show Management. Changes will be posted in the Facebook event, sent via email to the email on the entry form and posted in the show office. Horse Show Management reserves the right to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of, or incident to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these Rules and Regulations shall be decided by Horse Show Management; its decision to be final.

TREATMENT OF HORSES: Show Management will enforce the fair and humane treatment for all horses participating in the Thoroughbred Incentive Program (T.I.P.) Championships. Any horse that arrives at the Kentucky Horse Park with a Henneke Body Condition Score below 4.0 (out of 9.0) will not be allowed to compete. Information on Body Condition Scoring can be found at this link: [body-condition-score-chart.pdf](#). Horses can be excused from competition at any time for the following reasons: unsoundness, dangerous or out of control riding, or poor horsemanship/sportsmanship on the part of the competitor or any person associated with a competitor or entry. If a horse is excused for any of the above reasons

it must leave the competition arena immediately and receive approval from Horse Show Management before participating in any further portion of the competition.

PARTICIPATING RIDER CODE OF CONDUCT: The Jockey Club (TJC) expects appropriate behavior from all riders, trainers, spectators and others participating in any TJC event, including events held in conjunction with TJC events. Inappropriate behavior may include, but is not limited to: possession, use or distribution of any illegal drugs; profanity, vulgar language or gestures; harassment (i.e., using words or actions that intimidate, threaten or persecute others before, during or following TJC activities); failure to follow rules; and abusing a horse. Any verbal or physical act of discourtesy toward a judge, show official, volunteer, show staff or staff member on the part of a trainer, owner, rider, handler, groom, family member or person associated with an entry is a violation of the Code of Conduct. Reports of inappropriate conduct or discourtesy may be made at any time to Horse Show Management via email, text, phone call or in-person. Persons found by Show Management to be in violation of this Code of Conduct will be unable to participate in the remainder of the show, will forfeit all fees and awards from previous classes and divisions, and will be ineligible to show at the T.I.P. Championships in 2023, and/or at events held in conjunction with T.I.P. Championships and/or T.I.P. Championships in future years.

THOROUGHBRED MAKEOVER RULES: The following Thoroughbred Makeover Rules apply to T.I.P. Championships: Code of Conduct; Drug Testing; Horse Welfare – Abuse and Neglect; Coggins; Health Certificates; and Vaccination Records; COVID-19 or other public health crisis. See [therrp.org](#) and click on Thoroughbred Makeover, then Compete, then Rulebook.

REQUIRED COGGINS, HEALTH CERTIFICATES, AND VACCINATION RECORDS: All horses on the grounds of the Kentucky Horse Park are required to have:

1. Current (within 12 months) proof of negative Coggins; and

2. A health certificate. Health certificates must be issued within 30 days of entrance to Park for out-of-state horses and within 12 months of entrance to Park for in-state horses; and
3. Proof of vaccination for equine herpesvirus-1 (EHV-1 or “Rhino Flu”). Records must reflect vaccine administration no more than six months (April 9, 2023) and no less than 14 days (September 25, 2023) prior to arrival at the Kentucky Horse Park. This means that every horse at the Kentucky Horse Park during the T.I.P. Championships must have been vaccinated for EHV-1 between April 9 and September 25, 2023. The following are the only forms of accepted vaccination documentation: a) Bill/receipt with vet practice name, contact info, date, and horse’s name, indicating EHV-1 administration b) A letter on practice letterhead, signed and dated, certifying administration c) Name and vaccine type noted by veterinarian on signed health certificate/import documents.

Participants should be prepared to show these documents upon arrival at the Kentucky Horse Park, at check-in, and at any point throughout the event. Horses with insufficient health paperwork at arrival to Park grounds may be stopped by the State Veterinarian, not permitted to enter the grounds and asked to leave. Horses with insufficient health paperwork at check-in with the competition office will be immediately quarantined and asked to leave the grounds.

ENTRIES: Entries open August 1, 2023. The closing date for entries is September 8, 2023. NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED.

Entries will be online via a link available at tjctip.com/About/CSF.

In addition to the entry form, each exhibitor must download and complete the Release, Assumption of Risk, Waiver of Liability, and Indemnity Agreement (“Release”). The Release must include all mandatory signatures, including legal guardian in the case of a minor exhibiting.

STALLS: Stalls are available at a flat rate for the week of \$225 per stall. This fee includes Kentucky Horse Park Equine Facility and Utility fees. Includes competition days plus one day arrival (October 10) and one day departure (October 15). Tack stalls will be available for \$225 on a first come, first served basis dependent on stabling capacity.

All competitors must reserve stalls by September 8, 2023. Ship-ins that are not stabling on the grounds will be charged the Kentucky Horse Park’s \$60 per horse ship-in fee for the event duration in lieu of stabling. This fee will be assessed at the gate and a pass provided to the vehicle. Pass must be displayed in vehicle at all times while on Park grounds.

Stabling fees do not include bedding. Competitors may use their own bedding or may order stabling supplies (bedding, mats, hay, and grain) directly from Dever. Dever is based at the Kentucky Horse Park (<https://deverrentals.com/feed-hay-bedding-paddocks/>; 859-233-9702) and will deliver stabling supplies to stalls prior to the competitor’s arrival. Please note that the floors of the 10 x 10 stalls are concrete and therefore require liberal bedding. Competitors are NOT required to strip stalls prior to departure.

Additional High Point awards may also be offered, including for horses adopted from organizations currently accredited by the Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance (TAA), RRP Thoroughbred Makeover alumni or 2023 RRP Thoroughbred Makeover entered horses.

IMPORTANT - In order to be eligible for AA, Junior, TAA or RRP High Point awards, the status MUST be listed on the 2023 Declaration Form or Hardship Request Declaration Form. In order to be eligible for the TCA/TAA adoption class and TAA High Point awards, the horse's eligible adoption organization MUST be listed on the 2023 Declaration Form or Hardship Request Declaration Form. It is the owner or rider's responsibility to indicate a horse or rider is eligible for ANY of these awards. Failure to indicate eligibility for each High Point award (including Junior riders) on the Declaration Form or Hardship Request Declaration Form will result in exclusion of horse and/or rider from calculation of the High Point awards.

Dressage Division Placements and High Point calculation: High Point will be based on the best single test per horse/rider combination. Division placements will be based on the average of the two tests. In case of a tie, the horse/rider with the highest single score is the winner; if the highest scores are the same, the next highest scores will be considered until the tie is broken.

For Divisions where multiple levels are combined (2nd through 4th, FEI, Western), when calculating the Division awards, points will be added to the final percentage score based on the degree of difficulty of the test as follows:

- Second Level, Western Dressage Basic Level, Intermediate I = +1
- Third Level, Western Dressage Level 1, Intermediate II = +3
- Fourth Level, Western Dressage Level 2 or 3, Grand

Prix = +5

- Western Dressage Level 4 or 5 = +7

Barrel Racing: Placements and High Point calculations will be based on Division average. In the case of a tie in the Division Average, the tie-breaker will be the fastest time from the second go-round.

Competitive Trail Division Placements and High Point calculation: High Point and Division placements will be based on combined score of the two courses. Ties will be broken by tie-breaker obstacles (up to 3).

DOGS: In accordance with Fayette County (KY) law, all dogs on the Kentucky Horse Park grounds must be on a leash. Dogs cannot run-at-large, even under voice command, and they must wear their current license and rabies tags at all times.

KENTUCKY HORSE PARK REGULATIONS - In compliance with the State of Kentucky Fire Code, the following are prohibited in stalls or barns:

3. light-duty extension cords designed for indoor-only use;
4. any 3-way adapters unless specifically designed for outdoor use;
5. any adapters without 3-prong connection.

PARKING: Kentucky Horse Park charges a vehicle parking fee of \$6 per day or \$18 for an event. Pass must be displayed in vehicle at all times.

- Halter will take place in the 130' x 330' Covered Arena and/or Annex rings
- Competitive Trail will take place in the cross-country field

LIABILITY: Competitors will release, waive and covenant not to sue, and further agree to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the following parties: Retired Racehorse Project, The Jockey Club, the Kentucky Horse Park, show participants (including riders, coaches, trainers, judges/officials, and other personnel), show officials and managers; the promoters, sponsors, or advertisers of the show; and all owners, directors, officers, officials, employees, representatives, agents, contractors, members, insurers and volunteers of any of the aforementioned parties of any kind (Individually and Collectively, the “Released Parties” or “Event Organizers”), with respect to any liability, claim(s), demand(s), cause(s) of action, damage(s), loss, or expense (including court costs and reasonable attorney fees) of any kind or nature (“Liability”) which may arise out of, result from, or relate in any way to the show venue or to participation in the Show or preparation for participating in the show, including claims for Liability caused in whole or in part by the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties or any one of them. Competitors acknowledge that they participate at their own risk and will sign competition entry agreements and liability waivers at the point of entry.

PHOTO RELEASE: By signing the entry form, I agree to waive the right of use of my photos/videos at the competition and grant The Jockey Club and the Retired Racehorse Project and their agent’s full use of any and all competition photos and video.

DRESSAGE ATTIRE: Proper attire please. Competitors must wear an ASTM-approved helmet in all T.I.P. Divisions.

WESTERN CLASSES AND COMPETITIVE TRAIL

ATTIRE: Junior competitors must wear an ASTM-

approved helmet in all T.I.P. Divisions. Adult competitors can wear either a western hat or ASTM-approved helmet. Western boots, collared and long-sleeved, button-up shirts required in all ridden classes. Western apparel or English apparel permitted in Competitive Trail classes only. Spurs, chaps and chinks are optional. For Halter classes, Western attire; or button-down shirts and slacks with close-toed shoes are also proper attire if a handler prefers not to wear traditional Western show clothes.

EQUIPMENT:

Barrel Racing: Wraps, protective boots, and hoof boots are permitted. Snaffle bits, combination bits, shank bits and hackamores may all be used with one or two hands. Any bit having a fixed rein requires the use of a curb chain or strap, including all shanked bits. Snaffle bit rings may be no larger than 4” in diameter. Smooth round, oval or egg-shaped, slow twist, corkscrew, single or double twisted wire, or smooth chain mouthpieces and straight bar or solid mouthpieces are allowed. Bicycle chain is prohibited in any equipment. Combination bits and hackamores may include a noseband constructed of nylon, leather, rawhide or rope. Any rawhide or twisted rope noseband that is part of a combination bit or hackamore must be padded. No other functional part of the bit or headstall may be constructed of rawhide; headstalls may include decorative rawhide. Headstalls, tie-downs and bonnets may not be constructed of wire, solid metal, or twisted rawhide or rope, no matter how padded. Flat nylon, cotton or leather tie-downs, bonnets and training aids are permitted. Spur shanks may not exceed 2.5 inches in length. Spur rowels may not exceed 1inch in diameter and must be blunt.

Halter: Horses should be presented in a properly fitted halter (leather preferred) and lead rope or shank. If the shank has a chain, it can be positioned under the chin ONLY.

Ranch Riding and Western Pleasure: Western tack required. Horses regardless of their age may be ridden with one hand on a standard western bit as approved

by AQHA Equipment Rules, or with one or two hands with a snaffle bit or bosal as described under AQHA Equipment Rules. AQHA Equipment Rules will apply unless otherwise noted by Show Management or in these Rules. Spur shanks may not exceed 2.5 inches in length. Spur rowels may not exceed 1inch in diameter and must be blunt.

Dressage and Western Dressage: No whips are permitted in T.I.P. Championship classes. USEF rules for Dressage (see USEF Subchapter DR120 and DR121) and Western Dressage (see USEF Subchapter WD-5) will be in effect. Bit check will be performed at random.

Competitive Trail: Equipment may be either English or Western. Wraps, protective boots, and hoof boots are permitted.

Mounted Division: horses must wear a saddle and a headstall with reins. Riding bareback or bridleless is prohibited. Martingales, tie-downs, or any mechanism that restrains the head or neck are prohibited. Horses may be ridden in a snaffle bit, bosal or hackamore regardless of age. Trainers shall ride horses in this tack with two hands. Combination bits are prohibited. Trainers riding in a shank bit will do so with one hand only. Two-handed riding in a shank bit will result in deductions from the score per obstacle element. Shank bits must be used with a curb chain or strap. Horses may be ridden in a bitless bridle.

In-Hand Division: Properly fitted halter (leather preferred) and lead, with or without a chain. If a chain is used, it may be fitted under the chin ONLY – chain may not be run through the horse’s mouth or over the horse’s nose. Horse may also be shown in a suitable bridle fitting the rules set forth under the Mounted Division section.

RULES: Classes will be conducted under current USEF or AQHA rules unless otherwise noted by Show Management or in these Rules. Whips are not permitted in

Dressage or Western Dressage Championships classes. All tests may be read in all Dressage classes.

DRUGS AND MEDICATION: The Drug Testing Rules in the Thoroughbred Makeover Rules apply to T.I.P. Championships. See therrp.org and click on Event Information, then Rulebook.

DRESSAGE RIDE TIMES: Ride times will be posted online and emailed to the email on the entry.

AT THE FACILITY: Schooling closes at dark in the outside rings. Schooling schedule will be made available at a later date. Do not enter the rings or arenas outside of schooling or competition times. Riding on marked trails is permitted. Show Management recommends riding in groups of two or more for safety. Arenas and rings are open for schooling during posted times ONLY.

Fees

- Entry Fee: \$225 per horse for first Division; \$100 per horse for an additional Division. If Barrel Racing is entered, will be considered the first Division for purposes of entry fees. Please note, horses also competing in the Thoroughbred Makeover must enter T.I.P. Championships and pay T.I.P. Championship entry fees if they wish to cross enter into T.I.P. Championships.

**First Division fee also includes one entry in the Western Halter classes.
***Division fee also includes T.I.P. schooling and exhibitions for non-Makeover horses at designated times only.
- Stall Fee: flat fee of \$225 per stall. This fee includes Kentucky Horse Park Equine Facility and Utility

fees. Includes competition days plus one day arrival (October 10) and one day departure (October 15).

- Ship-in fee (required for all horses without a stall): \$60
- For horses competing in the Thoroughbred Makeover, there is no additional stall or ship in fee to participate in T.I.P. Championships.

GENERAL SPECIFICATIONS

1. T.I.P. Championships are open only to qualified and declared Thoroughbreds. A “Thoroughbred” is defined as any horse that has been registered with The Jockey Club (TJC) or a foreign Thoroughbred stud book recognized by TJC.
2. Each division is open only to horses that qualified and declared for that division.
 - a. Qualifying: To qualify for the Championships, a T.I.P.-eligible Thoroughbred must
 - i. Participate in a show offering T.I.P. high point awards, classes or divisions beginning August 1, 2020 through September 5, 2021; or
 - ii. Participate in Take2 divisions beginning August 1, 2020 through September 5, 2021;
 - iii. Be entered in the 2021 RRP Mega Makeover; or
 - iv. Have been qualified and declared for the 2020 T.I.P. Championships; or
 - v. Have participated in the 2020 T.I.P. Performance Awards; or
 - vi. Have been accepted through a Hardship Request.All qualifications must be in the applicable discipline. To qualify, horses can be shown in any Hunter, Jumper, Western or English Pleasure classes or divisions or any Dressage, Western Dressage or Combined Test classes at the show offering T.I.P. awards. Horses shown at a horse trial or combined test may also qualify for show jumping or dressage (as applicable). Virtual and online horse shows are not eligible for qualification.
 - b. Declaring: After qualifying, owners and riders must declare their horse for the Championships by submitting a Horse Declaration Form.
 - c. Hardship Requests: Hardship requests to qualify for Championships will be considered ONLY for Thoroughbreds that are being shown during the Championship year, but were not able to attend a show with T.I.P. Awards and did not participate in the Performance Awards. A Thoroughbred must attend a MINIMUM of two shows during the Championship year and must have been shown at the height or level being requested at one of those shows in order to be considered for a Hardship Request. To request qualification via a hardship request, you must submit a Hardship Declaration Form AND (i) a statement explaining in less than 500 words why you are not able to access shows with T.I.P. awards and (ii) a brief show record covering the Championship year, including show name, date, division, height jumped and any other relevant information. You must submit the Hardship statement by September 6, 2021.
3. In-Hand Championships offers \$500 in prize money plus prizes. Each T.I.P. Championship Division offers \$2,000 in prize money plus prizes.
4. High Point AA and Junior awards will be awarded in every Division except the Pleasure Divisions and In-Hand.
 - a. Junior – riders 18 years of age and under as of 12/1/20.
 - b. AA –Adult Amateurs only. For details on what constitutes Amateur status, please visit www.usef.org.
5. Cross-Entering: Each horse may only be entered in up to two (2) Championship Divisions total (across all disciplines). Horses must be qualified and declared for both divisions. Management reserves the right to limit, combine, split or cancel divisions. Horses limited to three dressage tests per day (this includes tests for CT). Each horse may only be entered in one in-hand class.
6. Cross-entering within the same discipline (Hunter, Jumper) (i) with the same rider must be at consecutive heights and (ii) with a different rider must be at consecutive heights unless a dispensation is requested and granted.
7. Horses limited to 4 O/F classes per day
8. Special, Handy and Challenge class winners receive special prize.
9. Jump Height: For jumping divisions, the horse may be entered at or above the lowest height jumped during the Championship year.
10. Dressage Level: For Dressage, each horse may entered at or above the lowest level competed during the Championship year.

HUNTER DIVISION SPECIFICATIONS Aiken, South Carolina

Each Hunter Division consists of 3 O/F classes and 1 U/S class.

- Hunter Over Fences - To be shown over approximately eight fences at the required height. To be judged on performance and soundness unless otherwise noted.
- Hunter Over Fences Handy - Course may include, but is not limited to, halt on course, trot fence, roll back, negotiating natural obstacles, bending line, bounce or a fence jumped in a direct line to/from the in gate. etc.
- Hunter Under Saddle - To be shown at a walk, trot and canter. Light contact with the horse's mouth is required. May be asked to hand gallop at the discretion of the judge, but no more than eight horses to gallop at one time. Martingales not permitted. Crossrails, Very Green, and Beginning Divisions will not be asked to gallop.

Hunter courses will simulate fences found in the hunting field such as brush, wall, in-and-out, oxer, post and rails, gate, aiken, bank, coop and panels. Management reserves the right to adjust fence heights or spreads as competition warrants.

Judging for all Hunter sections: To be judged on performance and soundness, suitability to count. Horses are not required to jog for soundness.

WESTERN HALTER CHAMPIONSHIPS SPECIFICATIONS Lexington, Kentucky

A halter class is defined as a class where the horse is judged based upon its conformation and way of going at a walk and trot in hand. Each horse may only be entered in one halter class. Entry for one (1) halter class included with your Championship Division entry.

Classed will be judged as Western Halter classes. Horses will walk to the judge one at a time. As the horse approaches, the judge will step to the right (left of the horse) to enable the horse to trot straight to a cone or marker placed 50 feet away. At the cone or marker, the horse will continue trotting, turn to the left making a true “L” and trot toward the next cone or marker placed before the left wall or fence of the arena. After trotting, horses will be lined up head-to-tail for individual inspection by the judge. The judge shall inspect each horse from both sides, front and rear. Judge may ask to see teeth on mares and stallions.

Minor blemishes and faults not considered. Braiding not required or considered except in Ranch Type classes.

Winner of Classes #1 through #6 will be entered in the \$500 Western Halter Championship, judged after the conclusion of class #6. Large classes will be split into sections for judging purposes – splits will be made available via email and in the Show Office.

1. War Horse Halter (won over \$100,000 or more than 50 starts) – Open to Thoroughbreds that have won over \$100,000 or raced over 50 times. Horses will be judged on presentation, behavior and correct conformation with respect of form to function for a performance horse.
2. Mares Halter – Performance Type: Open to Thoroughbred fillies and mares of a performance type. Horses will be judged on presentation, behavior and correct conformation with respect of form to function for a performance horse.
3. Mares Halter – Ranch Type: Open to Thoroughbred fillies and mares of a ranch type. Horses will be judged on presentation, behavior and correct conformation with respect of form to function for a ridden ranch horse. Horses should resemble a working horse. Silver, braiding, banding, fake tails, and hoof black/polish of any kind are prohibited.
4. Geldings/Stallions Halter – Performance Type: Open to Thoroughbred geldings and stallions of a performance type. Horses will be judged on presentation, behavior and correct conformation with respect of form to function for a performance horse.
5. Geldings/Stallions Halter – Ranch Type: Open to Thoroughbred geldings and stallions of a ranch type. Horses will be judged on presentation, behavior and correct conformation with respect of form to function for a ridden ranch horse. Horses should resemble a working horse. Silver, braiding, banding, fake tails, and hoof black/polish of any kind are prohibited.
6. TAA/TCA Aftercare Organization Graduate Halter – Open to Thoroughbreds adopted from a Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance accredited organization (see thoroughbredaftercare.org/taa-accredited-organizations/) or a Thoroughbred Charities of America Thoroughbred Rehabilitation, Retraining, Rehoming and Retirement Grantee (see .tca.org/rescue-grantees/). Horses will be judged on presentation, behavior and correct conformation with respect of form to function for a performance horse.

BARREL RACING SPECIFICATIONS

Lexington, Kentucky

Championships will be two go-rounds and an average. Championships will be a 4D format. The 1D is set by the fastest time. The 2D is one-half second slower than the fastest time. The 3D is one second slower than the fastest time. And the 4D is two seconds slower than the fastest time. Contestants must compete in both go-rounds to be eligible for Division awards. Calculation of Division Average: The contestant with the fastest combined time from both go-rounds wins the 1D Average. The 2D Average is one second after the fastest combined time. The 3D Average is two seconds after the fastest combined time. The 4D Average is four seconds after the fastest combined time.

An order of go will be posted. Once a horse is up in the order of go, the rider has two minutes to get to the gate or the horse may be scratched. It is the rider's responsibility to know the order of go and notify the gate of any delays or conflicts.

PLEASURE DIVISION SPECIFICATIONS

Lexington, Kentucky

The Pleasure Division consists of five classes. Horses to be shown at on a reasonably loose rein or light contact without undue restraint. Horses will work both ways of the ring at all requested gaits to demonstrate their ability with different gaits and leads. At the option of the judge, horses may be asked to lengthen stride at the walk, jog or lope, one or both ways of the ring. Horses are required to back easily and stand quietly. Judge may ask for additional work of the same nature from any horse. Passing is permissible. Judge will evaluate turnout and may inquire as to race history, with minor blemishes and faults not considered.

8. Western Pleasure Championship Division
 801. Western Pleasure Walk/Jog
 802. Western Pleasure Walk/Jog/Lope

803. Western Horsemanship: Western Horsemanship is designed to evaluate the rider's ability to execute a set of maneuvers prescribed by the judge (the pattern) with precision and smoothness while exhibiting poise and confidence and maintaining a balanced, functional and fundamentally correct body position. The following maneuvers are acceptable in a pattern: walk, jog, trot, extended trot, lope or extended lope in a straight line, curved line, serpentine, circle, figure 8 or combination of these gaits and maneuvers; stop; back in a straight or curved line; turn or pivot, including spins and rollbacks on the haunches and/or on the forehand; sidepass, two-track or leg-yield; flying or simple change of lead; counter-canter; or any other maneuver; or ride without stirrups. Competition pattern will be made available by July 1 at www.tjctip.com.

804. Western Pleasure Walk/Jog/Lope

805. Western Pleasure Rail: The following maneuvers may be requested: walk, jog, trot, extended trot, lope, extended lope or back.

RANCH RIDING DIVISION SPECIFICATIONS Lexington, Kentucky

The Ranch Riding Division consists of four classes. The purpose of the ranch riding class is to measure the ability of the horse to be a pleasure to ride while being used as a means of conveyance from performing one ranch task to another. No braided or banded manes/tails or tail extensions. Equipment with silver permitted, but not counted over a good working outfit. When exhibiting in a snaffle bit or hackamore, an exhibitor may switch between two hands and one hand on the reins at any time. Horses may cross enter Ranch Riding and Western Pleasure.

9. Ranch Riding Division

901. Ranch Rail I: The following maneuvers may be requested: walk, trot, extended trot, lope, extended lope.

902. Ranch Trail: Each horse will work individually. The Ranch Trail course will include no less than six and no more than nine obstacles. The horse may be asked to walk, trot and lope during the course. Obstacles may include: Ride over obstacles on the ground (usually logs); Opening, passing through and closing a hinged swinging gate (not a rope gate); Ride over wooden bridge; Backing obstacles; Side-pass obstacle; Drag an object; Jump Obstacle; Carry objects; Remove and replace materials in a mailbox; Cones; Swing rope or throw rope at a dummy steer head; Step in and out of obstacles; Put on a slicker or coat; stand to mount with mounting block; Open gate on foot; Pick up feet; and Lead at the trot. Competition pattern will be made available by July 1 at www.tjctip.com.

903. Ranch Rail II: The following maneuvers may be requested: walk, trot, extended trot, lope, extended lope.

904. Ranch Riding: Each horse will work individually. The following maneuvers are acceptable in a pattern: walk, jog, trot, extended trot, lope or extended lope, working lope, curved line, serpentine, circle, figure 8 or combination of these gaits and maneuvers; stop; back in a straight or curved line; turn or pivot, including spins and rollbacks on the haunches and/or on the forehand; sidepass, two-track or leg-yield; flying or simple change of lead; counter-canter; walk or trot over logs; or any other maneuver; or ride without stirrups. Competition pattern will be made available by July 1 at www.tjctip.com.

COMPETITIVE TRAIL DIVISION SPECIFICATIONS Lexington, Kentucky

The purpose of the Competitive Trail divisions is to demonstrate a horse's ability to be a trail horse, capable of maneuvering through a course of obstacles with physical skill, expression and a good mental attitude. You are being judged on your partnership with your horse. Your horse will be judged on attitude and performance. High scores are achieved by negotiating and completing obstacles smoothly, with balance and even cadence, surefootedness, and confidence. An ideal trail obstacle horse is one that is confident and willingly responds correctly to the rider's cues. Ultimately, the trail horse is skillful, eye appealing, confident, and leaves one with the impression of being sure, safe and a pleasure to ride over a course of obstacles. Major penalties may be assessed for performance of obstacles out of sequence, mistreatment of horses or going off course. In the Mounted Division, if a rider becomes dismounted and/or the horse runs loose, the horse is disqualified for that course. In the In-hand Division, if the horse runs loose, the horse is disqualified for that course.

Horses will complete a course of eight (8) to ten obstacles individually within a maximum time that will be provided based on course design. Horses will need to be prepared to encounter a variety of obstacles including, but not limited to, water crossing, dragging items, challenges to visual perception (e.g., water box), challenges to tactile stimulation (e.g., pool noodles, cowboy curtains), tests of surefootedness (e.g., bridges, raised poles), tasks while riding (e.g. mailboxes, picking up and carrying items), mounting/dismounting, backing, sidepassing, turns, and encounters with objects. Horses may be cross-entered in the Mounted and In-Hand divisions. Horses are not allowed within 100 feet of any obstacle in advance of their ride. No schooling of obstacles is permitted at any time. Courses will be made available at the event. Each Competitive Trail Division is 2 classes, with each class being a separate course.

NEW – Ride times will be assigned for Competitive Trail horses.

10. Mounted Division: The course will be designed to require each horse to show all three gaits (W/J/L) over a course of approximately eight to 10 obstacles.

T.I.P. PERFORMANCE AWARDS:

THE THOROUGHBRED INCENTIVE PROGRAM'S YEAR END "POINTS" PROGRAM

The T.I.P. Performance Awards are the year-end, self-reported competition awards of The Jockey Club Thoroughbred Incentive Program. The Performance Awards are **completely self-reported** by the Thoroughbred's owner or rider based on their participation in all shows and competitions. The awards recognize the Thoroughbreds accumulating the most points in each of the 13 categories and over 80 divisions, as well as Junior Riders and horses adopted from accredited aftercare organizations. To encourage the retraining of Thoroughbreds into other disciplines upon completion of their racing career, three categories and 12 divisions are limited to horses in their first two years off the racetrack.

The Performance Award Year is December 1 through November 30. Thoroughbreds accumulate points at all horse shows, horse trials, and other horse events. Shows must be recognized by an international, national, state or local organization and must be open to all participants. Horse shows do not have to offer T.I.P. awards to be included in the Performance Awards. All results and miles reported by owners and riders must be supported by horse show or competition results and will be verified by T.I.P. Only verified points and miles will be counted toward the Performance Awards. If results or mileage cannot be verified, the points will not be counted toward the award.

IT IS THE SUBMITTING OWNER'S OR RIDER'S RESPONSIBILITY TO PROVIDE VERIFICATION.

Performance Award points can be submitted electronically through your online account at www.tjctip.com or on paper forms. All forms and supporting documentation must be submitted by December 20.

The ultimate goal of the program is to distinguish horses with the potential to compete at the three- and four-star levels, but many fine horses that excel at the lower levels are also showcased by the program.

The YEH program provides an opportunity for breeders and owners to exhibit the potential of their young horses while encouraging the breeding and development of top event horses for the future. The program rewards horses who are educated and prepared in a correct and progressive manner. At Championships, young horses are also evaluated on their conformation in addition to the dressage test and jumping/galloping/general impression phase. 

DIGITAL CERTIFICATES OF FOAL REGISTRATION



Beginning with foal crop of 2018, The Jockey Club began issuing digital Certificates of Foal Registration instead of paper certificates. In order to receive a digital Certificate of Foal Registration from The Jockey Club or any other individual, race track or sales company, one must have an active Jockey Club Interactive Registration (IR) account. If you have a T.I.P. number for your horse(s), you already have an IR account and will be able to receive and assign digital certificates. If you do not have an account, simply sign up at www.registry.jockeyclub.com. The process is easy and the account is free.

To determine the current certificate manager/holder for any Thoroughbred foaled in 2018 or after, users will log on and check REGISTRATION STATUS from the homepage of your IR account. To receive a Certificate of Foal Registration, the current certificate manager must assign the certificate from their IR account to the new owner's IR account. The process is easily accomplished in minutes from your smart phone, tablet, laptop or PC with an internet connection. Once completed, the new certificate manager receives an email from Registry Alert, notifying them of the assignment. When you log on to your Jockey Club Interactive Registration account, you will see an option under DIGITAL CERTIFICATES labeled CERTIFICATE MANAGEMENT that will display the certificates currently assigned to your Interactive Registration account. Digital Certificates are not available for horses foaled prior to 2018.

For purposes of eligibility for all T.I.P. classes and awards, a “Thoroughbred” is defined as any horse that has been registered with The Jockey Club or a foreign Thoroughbred stud book recognized by The Jockey Club. In order to participate in a T.I.P. class or be eligible for a T.I.P. award, owners and riders must obtain a T.I.P. Number.
