Open to Qualified and Declared Thoroughbreds

IMPORTANT INFORMATION: Show Management reserves the right to combine, split, cancel, limit or move classes and divisions as entries warrant, which could mean divisions may change days on which they run or rings in which they are held. Classes may not necessarily be run in the order listed in the class lists. It is the responsibility of the rider to inform the Show Secretary of any time conflicts as soon as possible after receiving the schedule.

Management reserves the right to change officials, limit entries or divisions, combine or cancel classes, modify the schedule, and to modify or cancel awards and/or make whatever changes are required by circumstances to the competition specifications listed herein. Show Management reserves the right to cancel classes insufficiently filled and to refuse or require withdrawal of an entry for cause deemed sufficient by Show Management. Changes will be posted in the Facebook event, sent via email to the email on the entry form and posted in the Show Office.

Show Management will enforce the fair and humane treatment for all horses participating in the Thoroughbred Incentive Program Championships.

PARTICIPATING RIDER CODE OF CONDUCT –The Jockey Club (TJC) expects appropriate behavior from all riders, trainers, spectators and others participating in any TJC event, including events held in conjunction with TJC events. Inappropriate behavior may include, but is not limited to: possession, use or distribution of any illegal drugs; profanity, vulgar language or gestures; harassment (i.e., using words or actions that intimidate, threaten or persecute others before, during or following The Jockey Club activities); failure to follow rules; and abusing a horse. Any verbal or physical act of discourtesy toward a judge, show official, volunteer, show staff or staff member on the part of a trainer, owner, rider, handler, groom, family member or person associated with an entry is a violation of the Code of Conduct. Reports of inappropriate conduct or discourtesy may be made at any time to Horse Show Management via email, text, phone call or in-person. Persons found by Show Management to be in violation of this Code of Conduct will be unable to participate in the remainder of the show, will forfeit all fees and awards from previous classes and divisions, and will be ineligible to show at the T.I.P. Championships in 2025, and/or at events held in conjunction with T.I.P. Championships and/or T.I.P. Championships in future years.

Stable View reserves the right to refuse to accept an entry from any renter, owner, trainer, exhibitor or coach who has a past-due balance owed to Stable View.

Prizes and prize money awarded through 10th place for all of the Championship division placements above.

Open Divisions are open to all riders. Non-Pro Divisions are open to Junior Riders and Adult Amateur riders. It is the responsibility of the entrant to select the correct division at time of entry. No change of division can be made after September 24, 2025 absent extenuating circumstances. This includes moving from Open to Non-Pro or vice-versa.

The 2025 T.I.P. Championships at Stable View features a \$500 In-hand Championship.

Cross-Entering – Each horse may enter up to five (5) Championship Divisions total (all disciplines) subject to the following:

- Each horse may be entered in only one division at each height or dressage level (Open or Non-Pro); and
- Each horse may be entered in no more than 2 Dressage Divisions; and
- Each horse may be entered in no more than 2 Combined Test Divisions; and
- Each horse may be entered in only two jumping divisions (hunter and jumper divisions); provided, however, that if a horse has a second or third rider, then the horse may be entered with the second or third rider in one additional hunter division at or below 2'3" (for a total of three jumping divisions).
- Cross-entering within the same discipline (Hunter, Jumper) (i) with the same rider must be at consecutive heights and (ii) with a different rider must be at consecutive heights unless a dispensation is requested and granted.

Qualifying & Declaring for the Championships:

Qualifying: To qualify for the Championships, a [T.I.P. eligible](#) Thoroughbred must (1) participate in a show offering T.I.P. high-point awards, classes, or divisions beginning August 1, 2024, through September 15, 2025 (qualifying shows would include the 2024 T.I.P. Championships and any Equine Trail Sports or NATRC competition for Competitive Trail qualification); or (2) participate in a Take2 division beginning August 1, 2024, through September 15, 2025; or (3) be entered in the 2025 Thoroughbred Makeover in the applicable discipline or have participated in the 2024 Thoroughbred Makeover in the applicable discipline; or (4) have participated in the 2024 T.I.P. Performance Awards in the applicable discipline; or (5) be accepted through a 2025 Hardship Request (below).

- Virtual or online horse shows do not count for qualification.
- To qualify, horses can be shown in any classes or divisions at the show offering T.I.P. awards in the relevant discipline.
- Horses shown at a horse trial or combined test may also qualify for the Championships through their show jumping or dressage phase (as applicable).
- All Thoroughbreds must have a T.I.P. Number to qualify.
- All qualified horses may also participate in the In-hand Championships (no separate in-hand qualification required).

Declaring: After qualifying, owners and riders must declare their horse for the Championships by submitting a Horse Declaration Form, available on the T.I.P. Website (Championships tab).

HARDSHIP REQUESTS - Hardship Requests to qualify for Championships will be considered ONLY for Thoroughbreds that are being shown during the Championship year, but were not able to attend a qualifying show and did not participate in the Performance Awards. To be considered for a Hardship Request qualification, a Thoroughbred must attend a MINIMUM of two (2) shows during the Championship year and must have been shown at the height or level being requested at one of those shows. To request qualification

via a Hardship Request, you must submit a completed Hardship Declaration Form including (i) a statement explaining in less than 500 words why you are not able to access shows with T.I.P. awards and (ii) a brief show record covering the Championship year, including show name, date, division, test (if applicable), height jumped (if applicable), and any other relevant information. **You must submit the Hardship Request form and statement so that it is RECEIVED by August 31, 2025.** You will be notified if your Hardship Request for qualification has been accepted prior to the closing of entries. Incomplete forms will not be accepted. **HARDSHIP REQUESTS WILL BE CONSIDERED ONLY IF THE HORSE HAS BEEN SHOWN DURING THE CHAMPIONSHIP YEAR.**

Qualifying through the Thoroughbred Makeover (or similar event)

- 2024 and 2025 Thoroughbred Makeover horses are qualified for Championships in the same discipline(s) entered at the Thoroughbred Makeover. The table below shows the corresponding qualified disciplines and Championship division(s) where they are available. If you wish to show at T.I.P. Championships in a different discipline, you still have the option to complete a Hardship Request.
- Events similar to the Thoroughbred Makeover (e.g., Florida Transformation Expo) may also qualify according to the table below.

Additional Information:

Payment for all entries and fees are due at time of entry. Stable View reserves the right to refuse to accept an entry from any renter, owner, trainer, exhibitor or coach who has a past due balance owed to Stable View.

In-hand Championships are not a separate division and no qualification is required. Your first Division entry at each show includes one entry in the In-hand Championships at the same show. Each horse may be entered in only one (1) in-hand class.

Each T.I.P. Championship Division offers \$2,000 in prize money plus prizes, except for the In-hand Championship, which offers \$500 in prize money plus prizes.

High Point Adult Amateur (AA) and Junior awards will be awarded in each Hunter, Jumper, Combined Test (CT), Dressage, Western Pleasure, Ranch Riding, and Competitive Trail Division. There are no AA or Junior high-point awards in the Halter Championships or English Pleasure Divisions.

Jump Height - For Jumping Divisions, the horse may be entered at or above the lowest height jumped during the Championship year.

Dressage Level - For Dressage, each horse may be entered at or above the lowest level competed during the Championship year.

Horses may be declared for multiple divisions, but can only enter five (5) Divisions. Show Management reserves the right to limit, combine, split, or cancel Divisions.
