

New Vocations All-Thoroughbred Charity Show & T.I.P. Championships

Frequently Asked Questions

Please note: all information about the show can be found in the prize list (click <u>here</u>) and in the horse show program available at the show.

- 1. Do I have to pre-enter for the New Vocations Show or T.I.P. Championships?
 - A. Both shows REQUIRE PRE-ENTRY. All horse show entry forms must be postmarked no later than August 15. All entries must be signed by the rider (parent or guardian if rider is under 18 years of age), owner and trainer. All entries must include an OPEN CHECK (e.g. a signed check made out to New Vocations without an amount filled in). NO EXCEPTIONS.
- 2. What does the stall fee include?
 - A. The Kentucky Horse Park offers 10' x 12' permanent wood box stalls. The stall fee is \$125 for three nights. Stalls will be available Thursday, Sept. 6 and must be vacated by 7 a.m. Monday September 10. No bedding, feed or hay is included.
- 3. I am arriving to the Kentucky Horse Park before Thursday at 9 AM is there an additional charge for the stalls?
 - A. Yes Early arrivals and late departures must notify Sarah Coleman (sarah@horseadoption.com), be indicated on your entry and incur a fee of \$50 per night per stall (including tack stalls). Setting up or bedding a stall prior to 9 a.m. on Thursday will be charged an early arrival fee, whether occupied by a horse or not. Horses staying after 7:00 a.m. on Monday will be charged a late departure fee.

All stalls will be secured. If your stall security is broken prior to your paid arrival date, you will be charged an early arrival stall fee of \$50 per day. The stalls are monitored daily by the KHP and show management. Setting up your stalls prior to horses arriving does get charged by the KHP as a stall being used so, therefore, show management will have to bill you an early arrival stall fee.

- 4. I also want a tack stall do I have to reserve that separately?
 - A. Yes Tack Stalls must be indicated on your entry and incur the stall fee of \$125 and an additional fee of \$50 per night for early arrival or late departures. Tack stalls fees cannot be split.
- 5. Is bedding or shavings provided?
 - A. Bedding is NOT provided. Please bring your own bedding or purchase on Park grounds. For feed and bedding contact Dever Services 859-233-9702 or www.deverinc.com.
- 6. What health paperwork do I have to have for my horse?
 - A. All horses entering Kentucky Horse Park grounds must have:
 - a. Valid proof of negative Coggins (within 12 months).
 - b. Certificate of veterinary inspection:
 - i. Horses arriving from outside the state of Kentucky must have a 30-day CVI

- ii. Kentucky-based horses must have a CVI within the last 12 months.
- c. Documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus vaccinations within 6 months prior to entering the grounds. The date of vaccination must be noted on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.

Horses that fail to arrive with appropriate paperwork will not be allowed to unload on Park grounds.

- 7. Can I show in both the Jr/AA and Open Divisions at the New Vocations Show?
 - A. No each horse/rider combination can show in EITHER the Jr/AA OR the Open Division.
- 8. How many dressage classes can I enter each day?
 - A. Horses are limited to a maximum of three (3) dressage rides per day. Horses can be shown in only two consecutive levels. (Example Intro and Training Level or Training and First Level, etc., includes eventing Test equivalents as follows: BN and N (Training), T (1st level), P (2nd level), I (3rd level), A (4th level)).
- 9. Can I show in more than one division at the Championships? What if they are different disciplines?
 - A. Each horse may only be entered in one (1) Championship Division. There is no cross entering in divisions on Sunday, even across disciplines.
- 10. When will the dressage times be posted?
 - A. Provisional ride times will be posted the Tuesday before the show at www.newvocations.org/kentucky-charity-thoroughbredshow or emailed if email address is provided. Final ride times will be posted in the show office by noon the day before the competition.
- 11. Will the show be run in the order listed in the class list?
 - A. Classes may not be run in the order listed in the class lists. Management reserves the right to change officials, limit entries, combine or cancel classes, modify the schedule and rings, and to modify or cancel awards and/or make whatever changes are required by circumstances to the competition specifications listed herein. Show Management reserves the right to cancel classes insufficiently filled and to refuse or require withdrawal of an entry for cause deemed sufficient by Show Management.
- 12. I may have a conflict in two rings what do I need to do?
 - A. It is the responsibility of the rider to inform the show secretary of any time conflicts as soon as possible after receiving the schedule.
- 13. Can I add or scratch classes at the show? What if I have to scratch the horse completely?
 - A. There is no add/scratch fee to change or scratch out of a class at the show. But if you have to scratch a horse completely, entries for classes will be refunded only upon presentation of a vet certificate pronouncing the horse unfit to show. If a horse is deemed unfit to show, the stall and administration fees will not be refunded and that entry will endure a scratch fee of \$30.
- 14. Where is the Show Office?
 - A. NEW for 2018 The Hunter/Jumper Show Office and the Dressage Show Office are located in the Show Offices near stabling. Office Hours:

Thursday, Sept. 6: 8:00 a.m. to 7 p.m.

Friday, Sept. 7: 6:30 a.m. to conclusion of Jumper Stakes Saturday, Sept. 8: 6:30 a.m. to conclusion of Hunter Derby

- 15. How do I get to the Rolex Stadium and Walnut Ring?
 - A. There is a map in the horse show program and you can follow the New Vocations signs indicating Rolex Arena. All mounted competitors must use the horse paths do not hack on the road AT ANY TIME. Mounted competitors walking on the road will be ticketed and fined.

Please note that the approximate walking time from the barns to the Rolex Arena and Walnut Ring is 10 to 12 minutes. Please build this in to your time frame for arriving at the rings on time.

- 16. How do I get to the Dressage Rings?
 - A. There is a map in the horse show program and you can follow the New Vocations signs to dressage rings. From the stabling area, go up the green ramp.
- 17. How do I get to the Murphy Ring?
 - A. There is a map in the horse show program and you can follow the New Vocations signs to the Murphy Ring. From the stabling area, go up the green ramp and turn left.
- 18. How do I get my prize money for the Jumper Stakes and Hunter Derbies?
 - A. Prize money for the New Vocations All-Thoroughbred Show will be given in the ring or will be available to be picked up in the show office.
- 19. How do I get my prize money for the T.I.P. Championships?
 - A. All prize money won at the Championships will be mailed to the winner following the event. Prize money certificates will be available in award bags or can be picked up from the show office. Leave all completed prize money certificates with the show secretary or mail it after the show to The Jockey Club T.I.P., 821 Corporate Dr., Lexington, KY 40503.
- 20. Where do I get my ribbons and prizes for the New Vocations Show?
 - A. Class ribbons for flat classes can be picked up at the ring. Class ribbons for Over Fences classes, Division Champion, Division Reserve Champion and High Point ribbons and prizes can be picked up in the show office once results have been received and processed.
- 21. Where do I get my ribbons and prizes for the T.I.P. Championships?
 - A. All ribbons and prizes will be presented in a Winner's Circle at the conclusion of the Division. There will be a Hunter/Jumper/Pleasure Winner's Circle and a Dressage Winner's Circle.
- 22. Do I have to show in 2 jumper classes on Friday to compete in the Jumper Stakes?
 - A. Yes, the same horse-rider combination has to compete in 2 jumper classes on Friday in order for the same horse-rider combination to compete in the Jumper Stakes. No exceptions.
- 23. Do I have to show in 2 hunter or Equitation classes on Friday or Saturday to show in the Hunter Derby on Saturday?
 - A. Yes, the same horse-rider combination has to compete in 2 hunter or equitation classes on Friday and/or Saturday in order for the same horse-rider combination to compete in the Hunter Derby. No exceptions.

- 24. Is braiding required?
 - A. Braiding is not required, though many people do braid.
- 25. Is a shadbelly required for the Hunter Derby or Championships?
 - A. No, though some people choose to wear one.
- 26. How are the New Vocations Show high point awards calculated?
 - A. High point awards are calculated based on the horse's participation on Friday and Saturday only. Please see the prize list for a description of the classes included in each award. In Hand classes do not count toward the Hunter, Jumper, English Pleasure or Beginner OTTB classes.
- 27. Do I have to be present at the Thoroughbred Recognition Ceremony to win an Additional Thoroughbred Award?
 - A. While we encourage all exhibitors to participate in the Thoroughbred Recognition Ceremony, you do not have to be present to win. Prizes may be picked up in the Show Office. Only horses with Thoroughbred Info Sheets on file are eligible for the award. Info sheet is available at http://www.newvocations.org/assets/2015/05/TB_Info_2018-1.pdf?bb48a3&bb48a3.
- 28. Is there schooling over fences in the Jumper ring every day?
 - A. No, there is only schooling over fences in the Jumper ring on Thursday and Sunday (6:00 AM 8:00 AM only). No jumping is permitted in the Jumper Ring during schooling time on Friday or Saturday and Jumpers may not school in the hunter ring.
- 29. How are the hunter over fences classes and jumper classes run at the same height?
 - A. At the New Vocations Show in all rings, Jr/AA and Open Divisions over-fences classes will run concurrently at the same height, open card. All hunter flat classes are run in the Murphy Ring.
- 30. Can I show in western pleasure classes without a helmet?
 - A. Western headgear is permitted in Senior Division on adults over the age of 18 only. Protective headgear may be worn without penalty in the Senior Division by adults over the age of 18. ASTM/SEI approved helmets must be worn in the Junior Division.
- 31. When and where are the Jumper Stake courses posted?
 - A. The Jumper Stake courses will be posted at approximately 4:00 PM Friday at the Jumper ring and at the Show Office.
- 32. When and where are the Hunter Derby courses posted?
 - A. The Hunter Derby courses will be posted at approximately 4:00 PM Saturday at the Jumper ring and at the Show Office.
- 33. When and where are the Jumper Stake draws posted?
 - A. The Jumper Stake draws will be posted at approximately 4:00 PM Friday at the Show Office.
- 34. When and where are the Hunter Derby draws posted?
 - A. The Hunter Derby draws will be posted at approximately 4:00 PM Saturday at the Show Office.

- 35. Where are the jump courses posted?
 - A. Courses are posted next to the ring.
- 36. Where are changes to classes or the schedule posted?
 - A. Changes will be posted in the Facebook event (https://www.facebook.com/events/132584094249936/), sent via email to the email on the entry form and posted in the show office.
